Visiting Music Teacher - Drumkit and Percussion

VMTs are employed by Bromsgrove School to work for a set amount of lessons per week, and some VMTs also contribute to the extra-curricular life of the schools by leading ensembles. The nature of the job is to teach individual lessons, although some group lessons also take place. Each teacher brings their own strengths and subject specialisms to the job. The nature of the job is to teach a wide variety of ages of pupil with a range of abilities, and to develop the pupil's very individual needs musically on a one-to-one or group basis. VMTs should deliver a balanced programme, tailored to needs of the individual, including the teaching of aural awareness, sight-reading, theoretical and analytical skill and historical context.

Responsibilities

- Foster a love of drumkit playing in all age groups and abilities, offering trial lessons to new students seeking tuition
- Teach according to need individual drumkit lessons across prep and senior schools.
 This is currently 7 hours per week, although the ideal candidate would be able to offer extended hours to accommodate additional requests
- Prepare students for performances, examinations, auditions and recordings from beginner level to Diploma, including public examination performance preparation
- Support Prep and Senior School ensembles by performing with them, if required
- Write two annual reports and attend an online parent/teacher meeting once per year
- Attend meetings as required with other departmental staff
- Undertake other administrative duties as may be necessary for the purpose of the job

Subject to availability, interest and expertise, there may be opportunities to lead ensembles according to the candidate's specialism(s) in conjunction with the Director of Music.
