A Word from the Headmaster

As I write, the new school year is well underway, and pupils, both new to Bromsgrove and those returning, are already fully immersed in the wide range of opportunities that characterise a Bromsgrove education. It goes without saying that the best schools offer a breadth of experiences designed to develop young people as fully as possible, so that they are well prepared to follow their dreams, to thrive beyond school, and to play their part in making the world just a little better. Of course, pupils are not all the same, nor are their aspirations, and they will, quite rightly, choose a wide variety of paths.

The start of the year is also a natural moment to reflect on last year's leavers, of whom we are immensely proud, not only for what they achieved, but for the talented and thoroughly decent young people they have become. Many of them played a key role in setting such a positive tone across Bromsgrove.

You can read about their excellent results in the pages that follow, including the outstanding IB results that placed Bromsgrove as a Top 7 Global Co-Educational IB School. A level, BTEC, and GCSE results were also excellent, and 90% of leavers secured their first-choice university place. This month, a quarter of them will begin courses at a World Top 50 university and a sixth will be studying abroad. In the UK, the most popular destinations for Bromsgrovians were Bath, Birmingham, Durham, Exeter, KCL, LSE, Nottingham, and UCL. Further afield, OBs will be making their mark at institutions including Barnard, Boston, Columbia, NYU, Rice, Washington, Toronto, HKU and CUHK, Bocconi, Leiden, Stockholm, and the École Supérieure de Commerce de Paris.

University is not the right path for everyone, of course. A small number of leavers have opted to take planned gap years; others have secured prestigious degree-level

apprenticeships including with Rolls-Royce, Airbus, and Williams F1. One won a place to study music at a conservatoire, and another will begin training at Norland, the world's oldest and most prestigious childcare training institution.

We wish all those recent leavers every success and happiness and hope they will always stay in touch with their School.

For current pupils, we continue to seek to build on our academic strengths and on the many other areas that make up a rich and nurturing school experience. One day, today's pupils will choose their own paths beyond School, but for now we hope they thoroughly enjoy taking full advantage of everything on offer here.

We are delighted with this year's results across GCSE, A level, IB and BTEC. As regards universities, the picture is very encouraging; an unprecedented 90% have secured their first-choice place, and the vast majority of the remainder will be going to their insurance choice. 100+ of our Sixth Formers received top Russell Group universities with LSE, Imperial, Cambridge, Oxford, Durham, Exeter and UCL being favourite destinations for our leavers. Some have secured apprenticeships with Ballards LLP, Carter Jones, Williams F1 Racing and many more.

This marks a truly special moment in our School's history, and we're thrilled to have them as part of our diverse and vibrant community.



Track and Field

Year 7 twins Hari and Jai Vijh have made history with record-breaking performances at the National Prep Schools Athletics Finals.

Hari became the first Bromsgrove student to win three gold medals at the event—in the High Jump, Long Jump, and 4x100m relay—setting two national records. His High Jump result ranks him equal 1st in the UK.

Jai also excelled, winning gold in the 75m Hurdles (a national record), gold in the 4x100m relay alongside Hari, and silver in the Long Jump. His Hurdles time ranks him 2nd in the UK, and his wind-assisted time is the fastest nationally.

We are incredibly proud of these outstanding achievements from two of the UK's top young athletes.



Young Translator

Barbara Britanishskaia has won the Midlands prize in the Anthea Bell Prize for Young Translators for her Russian Level 4 entry. The national competition, run by the Queen's College Translation Exchange, involved over 22,000 students across six languages. Her translation was selected from nearly 5,000 entries, judged by a panel of experts and Oxford students.





Aston Villa Camp

Aston Villa hosted a football camp at the School over the Summer holidays. Along with pupils from Bromsgrove, many more came along from the local community, and it was a week of learning new skills, competitive spirit and teamwork. A special well done goes to Phoebe Lloyd who took home 'Coaches Player for the Week' in the Senior category.





England

Krystof Wood was selected for England Rugby's tour to South Africa. Krystof travelled with the School on our recent tour and was subsequently chosen for England following his impressive performances for Gloucester Rugby at the academy festival.

To mark the 80th anniversary of VJ Day and the end of WWII, members of the CCF joined Bromsgrove's Royal British Legion and Civil dignitaries at the Burma Star Memorial in Bromsgrove town.






Equestrian

In the UK 29er National Championships, Stella and Ed reached 20th overall and 4th mixed team. Stella also raced at the WASZP World Championships in Weymouth. We are proud to report that she finished 58th in the bronze fleet, 11th female and 4th U19 - an excellent achievement considering this was her first ever event in the boat class.

Stella now goes on to study Geography and Politics at university, and will continue to sail whenever her calendar allows; she recently received an invite to the Athena Foiling Pathway, which aims to accelerate diversity, inclusion, and performance in sailing and wider maritime sports. Through world-class training, mentorship, and community outreach, Athena Pathway is shaping the next generation of leaders on and off the water.
