Bromsgrove School, and indeed the world, was very different when the last Coronation took place seventy years ago; however, a variety of events took place across the School recently, to mark this rare but special point in our history. In years to come, pupils will hopefully remember how they celebrated the crowning of King Charles III.

As well as featuring some of the Coronation celebrations, the pages that follow show a sample of the many other opportunities and achievements that have taken place this half term, involving pupils of all ages. Some of those are relatively new initiatives whilst others would be similar to those enjoyed by previous generations of Bromsgrovians.

I look forward to continuing to see pupils participating in all that is offered here, further developing their many talents and interests in the process. Olympiads

Sixth Form pupils took part in the 2023 Chemistry and Biology Olympiad, with over 10,000 students from across the UK competing in the Chemistry Olympiad and over 13,000 students in 800 UK Schools competed in the British Biology Olympiad.

Congratulations to Serisha Sunner and Casey Wong who both achieved a Silver Award in the Chemistry Olympiad, which places them in the top 20% of the country. What is more impressive is that they are both in the Lower Sixth, whereas the vast majority of entrants are in their final year of Sixth Form.

Well done also to the nine students who received the Bronze Award (top 40%) of the country: Adryan Man, Amelia Baker, Ben Punt, Bowen Cheung, Hamza Suleman, Henry Scott, Clara Lau, Jake Wingfield and Yanbo Dong.

Congratulations again to Casey Wong who achieved Gold in the 2023 British



Biology Olympiad. Only the top 5% of students across the country received this accolade.

France



They then had a guided tour of the Fire-Station in Saint-Martin des Champs, and enjoyed their last picnic together in the Jardin des Plantes before travelling to Ouistreham to board the ferry back home.

As ever, the Grand-Ferme provided an excellent programme of activities which enabled our pupils to immerse themselves in the language, culture and history of France and, in particular, the Normandy region. Pupils also appreciated the excellent recreational facilities at the centre, which they could access during their down time. excellent views across Berlin. The pupils sat in a recreation of an East German factory, restaurant and supermarket to get a real understanding of what life must have been like.


The final treat was a trip to a planetarium where there was a 3D explanation of different planets. Fortunately, there were headsets available with an English translation!

In Senior School students demonstrated excellent creativity in action.


Art Exhibition

The final score was 6-1. this tremendous results makes them U18 National Hockey Tier 3 Champions.

This fantastic result rounds off an excellent season for the boys who have a record of 25 games played; 21 wins, 2 draws and 2 losses.

George, who had had the experience of the previous days' fencing to become more used to the required level, managed two wins in his pool, gained a bye through the last 128 before being narrowly defeated, 15-11, in the last 64, to finish 47th. Jasper fought well to finish 68th.
